Mission and Overview

Adventure Acres Foundation is a nonprofit organization established to promote environmental stewardship and regenerative land practices through education, demonstration projects, and community engagement. The Foundation's purpose is exclusively charitable and educational within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Programs and Activities

1. Environmental & Sustainability Education

The Foundation develops and hosts educational programs, workshops, and retreats that teach sustainability, regenerative agriculture, water conservation, and eco-building practices. These programs will serve local residents, schools, and visiting learners, encouraging hands-on participation and connection with nature.

2. Land Restoration and Demonstration Projects

The Foundation maintains and restores native landscapes in Southern Colorado using regenerative design techniques such as soil rebuilding, native plant reintroduction, and water catchment. These sites function as outdoor classrooms and demonstration areas to show practical, replicable sustainability solutions.

3. Community and School Engagement

The Foundation will collaborate with schools, nonprofits, and community organizations to provide field trips, volunteer opportunities, and educational experiences. It will also offer free or low-cost workshops to the public to ensure accessibility for all ages and income levels.

4. Retreats and Wellness Programming

Seasonal retreats will integrate environmental education with mindfulness, wellness, and outdoor recreation, emphasizing the restorative relationship between people and the natural world.

Beneficiaries

Primary beneficiaries include local residents of Fremont County, Colorado; students and educators seeking sustainability learning experiences; and visitors participating in eco-education programs. All activities are open to the general public without discrimination.

Funding and Operations

Funding will come from public contributions, small grants, educational program fees, and charitable donations. The Foundation is operated by volunteers and has no paid employees at this time. All funds will be used to advance the organization's charitable and educational purposes.

Future Plans

Within its first three years, Adventure Acres Foundation plans to:

- Establish on-site educational and demonstration zones for regenerative land practices;
- Host seasonal workshops and school partnerships;
- Build collaborative relationships with local conservation and education organizations; and
- Develop grant-supported programs that provide environmental education resources to underserved schools.

Public Benefit

All programs will serve the public by improving environmental literacy, supporting ecological restoration, and encouraging sustainable living. No part of the Foundation's income or assets will inure to the benefit of any private individual.
